He graduated from Central High School in Pueblo then attended the University of Colorado in Boulder on a track scholarship. In 1964 he married Linda Cain and moved to Garland, Texas. Harold worked at Irving Tool & Mfg.Co. in Garland and became President and GM in 1976. He continued in that position until his retirement in 2018. Harold was an avid sportsman.
