**G**uyanne Tittle Booth passed away on March 5, 2019. Guyanne was born in Dallas, Texas on September 15, 1932 to Dr. and Mrs. Guy A. Tittle (Willola Buster). She attended Bradfield Elementary, the Hockaday School, and Randolph Macon. In 1952 she married the love her life, Charles Clinton Booth. Guyanne grew up in the East Dallas Christian Church and after living in Virginia, Austin, Corpus Christi, and at Flat Top Ranch, Walnut Springs, Texas, she and Clint returned to Dallas. In 1989 she and Clint joined the Church of the Incarnation. Guyanne was an avid reader and life long student, studying Ancient Greek and the Bible throughout her life. She was a supporter of the C. S. Lewis J. R. R. Tolkien Society, organizing numerous Bible Studies and events for over 30 years. She was awarded an honorary degree from the St. Thomas More College.
