## **Russell Lowell Reid**

DEC 30, 1925 - OCT 31, 2018

**R**ussell Lowell Reid, 92, of Dallas, TX, died October 31, 2018 in Dallas, TX of natural causes. He was born December 30, 1925 to Tony Hyde Reid and Hattie Lewis Reid in Mabank, TX. He married Colleen Wilkerson on February 26, 1955. He was a manager for Western Electric and later AT&T, retiring after 40 years of service. He met his wife at Western Electric and they enjoyed 63 years together. He joined the US Navy at the age of 18 in 1944, spending two years in Sasebo, Japan as a landing craft captain, and was awarded the World War II Victory Medal, the American Campaign Medal, and the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal. He was a life member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. He was also a charter member of the National WWII Museum in New Orleans, LA. He is survived by daughter Sharon Ruhl of Rowlett, TX, son Russell Reid, Jr. of Washington, DC, grandchildren Sarah Miller of Milano, TX, William Russell Reid and Elizabeth Reid of Dallas, TX, and great-grandchildren Slade Miller of Milano, TX and Sable Miller of Laredo, TX. He was preceded in death by parents Tony and Hattie, 1 brother, Delbert Reid of Houston, TX, and two sisters, Letha Stephens and Doris Inwood of Dallas, TX.
