He started his education in a one-room schoolhouse operated by his mother and ultimately pursued accounting, graduating from the University of Illinois. In 1951 he was married to the love of his life, Yvonne Renee Drapeau of Oak Park, Ill who preceded him in death Jan. 24, 2009. Dave was employed by Collins Radio Company who provided communications for the Aviation and American Space Programs. Dave continued his work with Collins as a controller, then Rockwell International until his retirement.
