Dr. Jaspreet Singh Sidhu, son of Dr. Rajinder Singh and Parmjit Kaur Sidhu, was born on December 23, 1978 in Bhana, Punjab, India. From an early age, Jaspreet had a passion for medicine and helping those in need. He received his medical degree from the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, and completed his residency training at St. John Hospital and Medical Center in Detroit, Michigan. He was highly accomplished in his career focusing on high risk obstetrics at Medical City Dallas and Arlington. Jaspreet passed away peacefully on January 28, 2018 in Dallas, Texas at the age of 39. He is survived by his wife, Dr. Amarita Klar, daughter, Amarra Jas, brother, Harsimran “Harry” Sidhu, sister-in-law, Hardeep Sidhu, and nephew, Hukm Sidhu.
