He and Betty returned to Pennsylvania, where he joined the Army National Guard and went back to work for U.S. Steel. They continued to live in Pennsylvania, where all three of their children were born. In 1981, Bill transferred to U.S. Steel in Garland, Texas, and also transferred from the Army National Guard to the Air National Guard. After retiring from U.S. Steel, Bill went on to become the Traffic Manager for Ingersoll-Rand in Garland. During his time as Traffic Manager for IR, he had the opportunity
