Ronald James “the Duke” Coyne, was born in 1924, in Sioux City, Iowa. He passed with his family at his side on June 18th, 2016 in Carrollton, Texas. Ronald was preceded in death by his beloved wife and mother of his four children, Donna Beth Rogers Coyne, on March 6th, 1999, as well as his brother, Kenneth in 2007 and his sister Corrine (Sister Walter Marie) in 1997.
