**R**eeves, Pauline Cochran 88, a native of Albany, NY passed away Thursday, June 30, 2011 at Horizon Bay Assisted Living in Louisville, KY surrounded by her family. She was a devoted and loving mother, grandmother and great grandmother. She was one of the first women to be elected Vice President of the National Bank of Commerce in the early '70's and went on to lead the commercial loan division of Dallas International Bank and head the personnel and business development efforts at Inwood National Bank. She served on the Board of Directors for United General Life Insurance Co; she was treasurer of Zonta Club I, was a member of the Business & Professional Women's Club of Dallas and the Sanger-Harris career board. After retiring from banking she launched a successful career as a designer and founded a design firm where she worked into her eighties.
