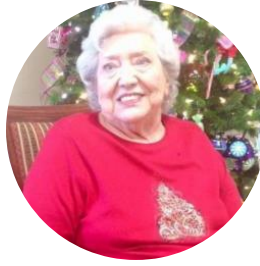


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# Willa Lou Wilson

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**W**illa Lou Wilson (Billie) of McKinney, Texas, went to be with the Lord on Saturday, February 8, 2020. She was born September 30, 1926, in Cowgill, Missouri, the daughter of James B. King and Bessie King. She was 93 years old.

Billie graduated from Crozier Tech High School in Dallas. She married Warren D. Blevins of Enloe, Texas in 1947. They were married for 18 years and had three children together. 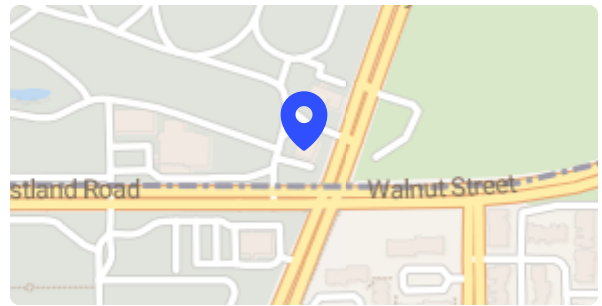

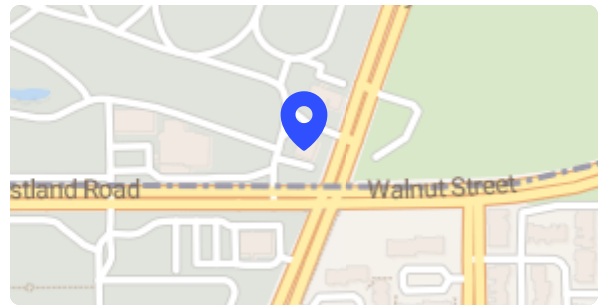
