KEFFER, Jean Cora Jean Keffer passed away on February 24, 2021, surrounded by her children. She was born to Jacob and Cora Moore in Stephenville, Texas, on June 22, 1925, but spent the majority of her early years in McCamey, Texas. In 1947 she married James Earl Keffer, who worked as credit manager for Continental-Emsco Oil Field Supply Company in Texas, Oklahoma, and Canada. Jean was a Mary Kay consultant for 50 years. She and Jim had been married for almost 60 years when he passed in 2007. Jean was also preceded in death by her parents, by her brothers J.C., Leon, Allen, and William Moore, and by her sister, Margaret Roberson.
