Also, she was embraced by three brothers - George, Cotton and Bobby Gene and a sister- Betty Jo. Larry, her younger brother would come several years later. The young family lived and worked on a 100-acre farm in Honey Grove, Texas.

Patricia married her high school sweetheart, Elbert Shannon in 1956. This union brought Patricia her most precious possessions, her daughters – Paula and Renee. After a few travels in Texas, the young family laid roots in Anaheim, California. Renee and Paula have fond memories camping in various locations in California and riding motorcycles on the salt flats. In addition, they lived in a cul-de-sac near lots of young families. There were some exceptional times in that California neighborhood and friends became as close as family.

In 1974, Elbert and Patricia divorced, and Renee and her moved to Plano, Texas to be close to her brother Larry and his family. Also, Patricia earned her Cosmetology license and worked in this profession for over 30 years.

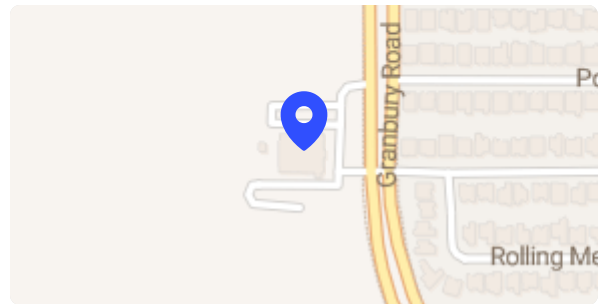

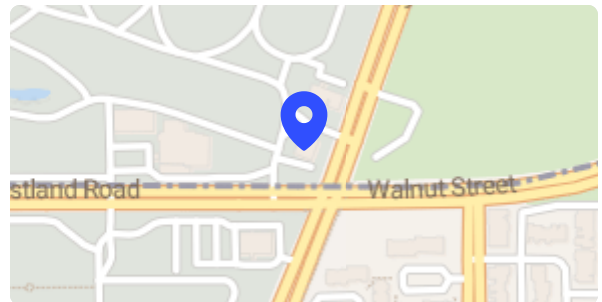

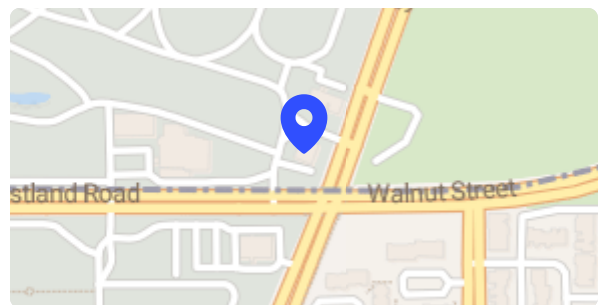
