Jean Ann Thompson Titus was born in Breckenridge Texas in 1928 to Eugene and Verna Whitacre Thompson. Her childhood was full of horseback riding, rodeo parades and water skiing on the lakes around her beloved hometown. Jean Ann attended the University of Texas where she became a member of The Alpha Phi sorority. After graduation, she moved to Dallas and went to work at the Statler Hilton, using her experience from working summers and weekends for her father at The Burch Hotel in Breckenridge. Soon after she moved to Dallas, she met and married Robert Elton Titus and together they raised two daughters. Jean Ann was a lover of music and art and instilled that love in her children. Jean Ann was a talented visual artist and began painting in high school. In Dallas, she studied with the Texas artist Otis Dozier and produced artwork for her home, family, and friends. She was humble about her talent, so many of her paintings were found in the attic.

Jean Ann spent her life devoted to Bob and their two girls, volunteering for events and clubs and chaperoning trips. She was a trustee for the Dallas Opera, a member of The Dallas Symphony Guild, The Dallas Bach Society, the Browning Club, The Craig Class, the Dallas Country Club, The Dallas Woman's Club and numerous other clubs and charities. Bob and Jean Ann loved to travel and the trips always included great classical music. A visit with Amy in Europe had to include getting to see at least two operas and plenty of Lieder. Trips to visit Sarah and Tilda often involved hearing a recital or attending the Metropolitan Opera. In her final years, she was most proud of the Titus Art Song recital series with the Dallas Opera. She loved sponsoring music that had special meaning to her and making sure Dallas was a center of artistic excellence.

Jean Ann was happiest hosting people in her home. She grew up in a home where there was always a place at the table for one more and that was evident in the inviting and open home she made for Bob and her two girls. Whether it was a family member from out of town, a friend from back home or friends of her daughters, there was always someone visiting and enjoying her

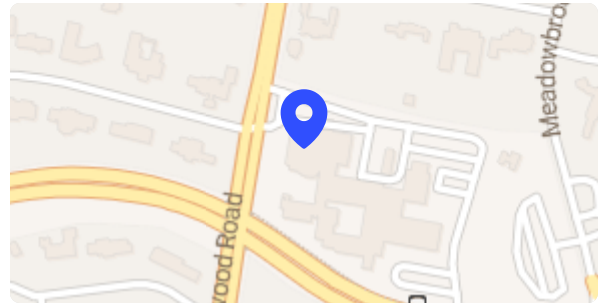
