Cheryl Watson Page, 60, of Austin, Texas passed on March 4, 2020. A 7th generation Texan born in Dallas, Texas on December 21, 1959 to Ernest "Steve" Watson and June Sherbet Watson, Cheryl was raised in Dallas and Fort Worth and graduated from the University of Arkansas with a degree in accounting in 1982. Cheryl earned her CPA license and practiced accounting in both Little Rock and Dallas.
