Mary Zaemes was born in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma on August 10, 1934 where she lived for most of her youth. During WW II her family relocated to Alexandria, Louisiana before returning to Oklahoma City after the war ended. She was active at church and much of her early life revolved around the Greek community and her family in OKC.
