"Well, ok," Peggy acquiesced, for the good of the caregiver. :) She even expressed remorse over complaining about her pain and discomfort (which she really did NOT) when she thought about how others, like during the Holocaust, suffered so much more. She was a grateful person...and I am grateful she was in my life.

This world, our world, was a better place because she was in it.
