Robert and Dolores added two children to their family, Melinda and Robert Jr. They raised their children in Dallas where Robert worked faithfully for 30 years at Bosco Bolt, Nut, Screw Co. Robert didn't know a stranger and made new friends wherever he went. He enjoyed laughing and listening to his favorite record by ABBA and mariachi bands. Visiting his parent's home in Irving, TX and enjoying great patio weather with his siblings was the highlight of his days. His children grew to get married and have families of their own.
