Wanda Lavern Williams Hamilton was born September 2, 1926, in Harlingen, Texas to Roy Van Williams and Alice Sibson Williams. She graduated from TSCW (TWU) in Denton in 1948. She worked as a chemist and toxicologist in various labs in the Dallas area. She married Clardy Burl Hamilton of Lubbock on March 26, 1949.
